## **Vestry Moves Forward on Mission and Ministry Goals**

The Vestry held a special planning meeting on the morning of Saturday, May 7<sup>th</sup> to take the next steps in our Mission and Ministry Goal Setting process. As many will remember, this work began with a Vestry Retreat May, 2010 in which a number of possible Mission and Ministry Goals were developed. In the summer and fall of 2010, all in the congregation were invited to indicate which goals they thought should have highest priority going forward, as well as which goals they might be willing to work at realizing.

At its recent special meeting, the Vestry drew on that parishioner input, along with our own prayer and discussion, to further focus prioritization of the goals and to make plans for the future. You should be proud of the hard work and faithful commitment of your Vestry.

### *Where We Are Now*

#### *Goals Already Being Worked On*

The Vestry first reviewed the One year Goals which we have already begun work on:

- **Youth Group**
  - Form an active Youth Group at St. Francis
- **Newcomers**
  - Develop a process to welcome, track & incorporate newcomers into the life of St. Francis.
- **Spiritual Growth**
  - Provide opportunities for bible study, the sharing of our faith stories and deeper fellowship.
- **Transportation**
  - Provide rides to parishioners who need them to/from church (and other places).

For each of these Goals, we considered the following;

- **Steps Taken to Date**
- **Next Steps**
- **Resources Needed/Available**
- **Obstacles**
- **Leadership in place and/or needed**

This review showed that much good work has begun in all these areas. It also provided direction to those working in these ministry areas for moving forward in the year ahead to further realize these goals.

## *Where We Are Going*

Next, the Vestry used a ranking process to prioritize the remaining One Year, One to Three Year and Three to Five Year Goals, with these five goals chosen as the most important.

- **Mission to Parish Status**<sup>1</sup>
  - Be recognized as an independent Parish of the Diocese
- **Identifying Talents and Skills**
  - Identify talents and skills that parishioners have to offer for the ministry of St. Francis.
- **Gifting/Tithing**
  - Develop a spirit and practice of generous giving in the congregation.
- **Intentional Invitation**
  - Develop multiple ways to invite the community to events and worship at St. Francis.
- **Community Needs Assessment & Community Outreach Projects**
  - Assess the needs in our community to which St. Francis could minister.
  - Develop community outreach project(s) based at St. Francis.

Initially, many on the Vestry hoped that we might be able to move forward on all of these goals simultaneously. However, as we looked at their implementation in more detail, using the categories we had used for the One Year Goals, it became clear that was unrealistic. We are already doing a lot and cannot pursue four or five new goals at once while maintaining and expanding the good work already begun on our One Year Goals.

In particular, we realized, leadership is a key issue. The Clergy and Vestry must provide oversight for the whole of the parish's mission and ministry, but cannot provide hands-on leadership for all our ministry goals. To move forward on our additional goals, broadening the leadership and participation base in the congregation is essential.

## *Next Steps*

With that in mind, the Vestry agreed that **Identifying Talents and Skills** should be the highest priority Goal over the next 6 to 12 months. By working on this goal, we will be to identify the leaders and participants needed to move forward on our other mission and ministry goals in the years ahead.

In the weeks and months ahead, you will hear more about the process of Identifying **the Talents and Skills** we know exist in this wonderful congregation. We look forward to the new work that God will be doing among us in the years to come.

<sup>1</sup> Progress on this goal is already going forward on the Diocesan level in response to a Resolution adopted by Diocesan Convention in March, 2011 to begin amending the canon law that governs congregational classification. Fr. Jack will be working with other Diocesan leaders on the implementation of that Resolution with the hoped for goal of St. Francis being recognized as a parish within two years.

## Finding Pasture

“Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture.” (John 10:9)

"Give me your tired, your poor, your huddled masses yearning to breathe free," (wording at the base of the Statue of Liberty)

When I first moved to Bridgewater I was thrilled because when giving directions, I could say “Go x miles from Thompson, and when you see the cows, turn right,” an area now a huge townhouse development. I would see hunters in camouflage walking into the woods with their dogs—now a large office ‘park’. I would take my dog for a walk in the field a few blocks from my house, spread out a blanket, and read – smelling all the wonderful scents of a warm summer field—now another huge office complex. There was not one traffic light in town. I was finally back in the ‘country’ where I grew up. I felt free from the constraints of city life. I had found my ‘pasture’, a place of refuge and safety.

Many years before that I had also found pasture—in a church. I was invited by a friend to attend a social event, was warmly welcomed, began to be included in the youth group, and discovered Jesus. I felt included, loved, and safe. And although I first was drawn to it by the warm, loving, members, it enabled me to grow in my understanding and love of God. Several years later, I visited my first Episcopal Church on invitation of a friend and knew that I had come home.

If you are not one of the (now rare) Christians who have always been involved with a church, think of the first time you stepped into one. What did you find? How did you feel? Recently someone mentioned how she felt arriving in one particular church. She said, “I felt like I was at home.” There is a wonderful book Finding Home by Christopher L. Webber. It’s full of true stories of people who entered the Episcopal Church and found what they were looking for. In each case, someone had reached out to them and statements as “I had come to the place where I belonged.” (pg. 9) Another, describing her first service said, “I knew I was home.” (pg. 38), and Colleen, who found “room to change and grow in response to the call of love.” (pg. 63)

My parents were immigrants and arrived in the United States seeking something that was lacking in their lives. Those arriving at the doors of St. Francis also come seeking something that is missing in their lives. They are seeking their own ‘pasture’; they may be seeking God and a closer relationship with him; they have just moved into the area and want to meet people; they may be looking for something for their children. They are seeking connection to...something.

To paraphrase the words that have inspired so many newcomers to this country and to paraphrase Jesus’ message of love and inclusion: “Give me your tired, your poor, your huddled masses yearning to find pasture in my field.”

That pasture is St. Francis. Be aware of the newcomers. Get to know them. Show them Christ’s inclusive love.

May you too be at home, surrounded by His love

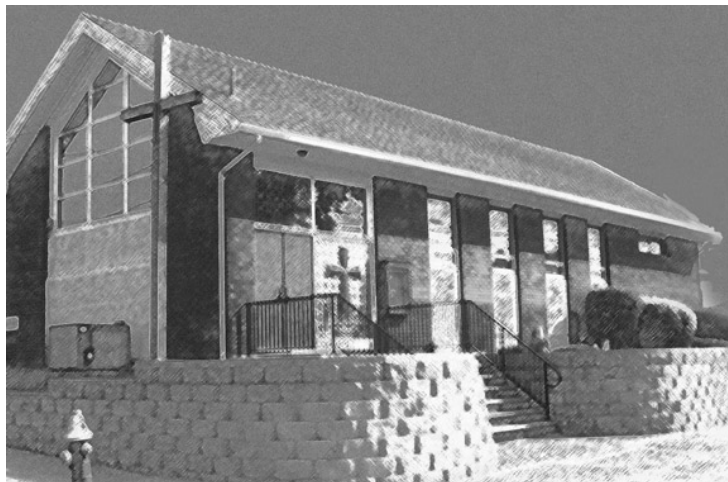

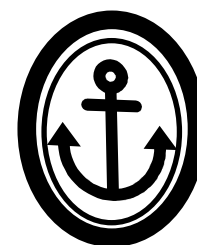
